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HERITAGE OF INDIA (GROUP OF MONUMENTS AT MAHABALIPURAM)

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ABSTARCT:

The Shore Temple in Mahabalipuram (Tamil Nadu, Southern India) exists since the late 7th century. Historical sources suggest that it was built on an island in honour of the gods Vishnu and Shiva. A former bridge over the canal, which separated the island from the mainland, and a seawall, which protected the shore from the waves are dysfunctional now, as they are located too high above the present-day sea level. A holy well, part of the temple complex, reaches down to the modern freshwater lens. We suggest that about 1 m uplift occurred after the construction of the temple, the canal and the seawall, but before the construction of the well. This event during the reign of King Rajasimhan in the early 8th century most likely was caused by an earthquake of magnitude M > 6.5 that led to the uplift of the island. There are thick walls of a ruined masonry building in the former, sand-filled canal, tilted in various directions. These are evidence for liquefaction of subsoil, caused by a second earthquake of intensity IX-X. The east coast of India has remained prone to destructive earthquakes: archaeoseismology proves to be useful tool which can help to identify these areas.



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

The collection of monuments there includes excavated temple ruins as well as monolithic temples, bas-relief sculptures, structural temples, and rock-cut cave temples. These magnificent structures were made by the Pallava dynasty, which governed this region between the sixth and ninth centuries CE. The Mahabalipuram Group of Monuments holds a special place in the history of Indian architecture. These magnificent structures serve as a reminder of the area's superior craftsmanship in the sixth century CE. These constructions were carved out of the surrounding natural landscape, showcasing the Pallava craftsmen's skill to the world. The monuments can be grouped into the following five groups: The rock-cut caves, or mandapas: When Narasimhavarman I Mamalla was in power, Cave temples, created by Narasimhavarman-I Mamalla, represented unprecedented advancements in the rock medium. Varahamandapa, Mahishmardhini Cave, and Konerimandapa are notable examples of cave temples. These rock-cut caves are lavishly decorated with sculptured images renowned for their suppleness and natural elegance. Mahishamardhini, Bhuvaraha, Gajalakshmi, Tirivikrama, and Durga stand out among them. The monolithic temples, or rathas: Due to their resemblance to a temple's procession chariots, the monolithic temples are known locally as "ratha" (chariot). Each of these five monolithic temples was carved from a sizable boulder. They illustrate variations in ground plan and height as well as the full form and elements of the modern temple form. They have wall panels that are intricately carved with artistic designs and pictures of several Hindu deities as well as royal portraits.

One of Mahabalipuram's most visited temples is the seaside temple. Here, beneath the sand, additional constructions have been discovered by excavations in the early 2000s. Three shrines are combined to form the temple. Shiva is the subject of both the larger primary shrine and the smaller secondary shrine. A monument called Descent of the Ganges, sometimes referred to as Arjuna's Penance locally, may be found in the Indian state of Tamil Nadu's Chengalpattu district in Mamallapuram on the Coromandel Coast of the Bay of Bengal. It is a massive open-air rock relief that is 96 by 43 feet (29 by 13 metres) in size and carved onto two monolithic rock boulders.

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Final sketches are used to analyse the required fabric type, GSM, Finishing, colours, and quality during the fabric sourcing process. According to the finalised design, custom crafted patterns with antique values and considerable historical significance are embroidered in cloth. Patterns must be drawn with ease and seam allowance after measurements have been taken. In order to achieve a seam strength of 30 IBS in woven textiles, place patterns on fabric, cut them out, then sew using SNLS with 8 to 10 SP1 and a 4-thread overlock to protect the raw edges from thread ravelling. After sewing is complete, a fit check must be performed, and adjustments are made based on the results. The project's intriguing last phase is about to begin. In order to capture and reach the target audience and market through the available means, such as magazines, journals, and social media, the model is photographed with a complete studio setup, makeup, and hairdo in high fashion mode.
